1 University Law School where he was awarded the
2 George E. Mears Scholarship International
3 Award. After law school, he became a clerk
4 for the judges in the First Judicial District
5 Court.

6 I first got to know him in 1986. He was
7 one of the first new attorneys hired in the
8 Public Defender's Office at that time. He
9 worked in the Caddo Parish Indigent Defender
10 office as a public defender as a staff
11 attorney assigned to Section 2. Handled many,
12 many, many cases on a daily basis. The
13 outstanding thing about Carl is that after
14 that is when he began his community service
15 work and volunteer work after a hard day in
16 court.

17 He was a clerk in the criminal justice
18 committee in the State House of
19 Representatives. Carl Survine was active in
20 the community and had been appointed by the
21 Caddo Parish Commission to be vice chairman of
22 the Citizens Study Committe on juvenile courts
23 and detention and was vice chairman of the
24 Citizens Study Committee on the parish jail in
25 1989.

26 In addition to the contributions in the
27 legal field, some of his outstanding
28 accomplishments in the field of community
29 service included volunteer activities which
30 were focused on assisting the educational and

1 professional development of young people. He
2 work at Rutherford House and Johnny Ray Jones
3 youth shelter. He served as chairman on the
4 Educating Tomorrow Advisory Committe of Caddo
5 Parish School Board. Carl served on the
6 Lighthouse board of directors. He served in
7 the First Presbyterian Church juvenile justice
8 program. Also as a youth mentor and coach
9 with the Lighthouse Educational Center with
10 the Volunteers of America. He coached a youth
11 basketball team in Ledbetter Heights and was a
12 foster parent for kids who have gone on to
13 become very successful.

14 The Carl Survine Scholarship Fund was
15 created as a living memorial to Carl, and on
16 behalf of his many friends and his family and
17 those who work with him, Carl was a lawyer and
18 a man of honorable who served his community
19 well. He will be missed by all, his family
20 and those who worked with him, and he was a
21 respected community leader.

22 I would ask that this memorial be made
23 part of the record of the First Judicial
24 District Court and a copy be made to be
25 distributed to his family.
