## In Memoriam

## Andrew Dixon Carroll June 26, 1905 - May 17, 1974

We, the undersigned committee designated by the Shreveport Bar Association to prepare and submit the resolution to the memory of the late Andrew Dixon Carroll, a former President of the Shreveport Bar Association (1959), submit the following:

Andrew Dixon Carroll was born in Mansfield, Louisiana, on June 26, 1905, the son of S. L. and Ada Fraser Carroll. He lived in Sabine Parish and attended the public schools of that parish. After graduation from high school, he attended Centre College of Kentucky in Danville, Kentucky, for one year, and then transferred to Louisiana State University in 1924. He graduated from the Law School with honors in 1928 and was admitted to practice by the Supreme Court of Louisiana on July 13, 1928.

He immediately began the practice of law with his uncle, the late Richard A. Fraser, under the firm name of Fraser & Carroll. In 1935 he moved to Shreveport and joined the firm of Pugh, Grimmett & Boatner. This partnership continued until his death, with the name of the firm changing during this period to Grimmett, Boatner, Simon & Carroll; Simon & Carroll; and finally to the present firm of Simon, Carroll, Fitzgerald & Fraser.

In addition to the Shreveport Bar Association, he was a member of the Louisiana State and American Bar Associations.

For many years he rendered outstanding service to the Law Reform Committee of the Louisiana State Bar Association.

Dixon Carroll possessed many great virtues. No lawyer enjoyed a greater reputation for integrity and ethical conduct in the practice of his profession. He was a gentle and kind

man and at the same time was strong and firm in his convictions and his representation of his clients.

Dixon Carroll is survived by his devoted wife, Elizabeth Irwin Carroll, two sons, Irwin D. Carroll of Dallas, Texas, and Sidney L. Carroll of Knoxville, Tennessee, and four grandchildren.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we of the Shreveport Bar Association in this memorial express our admiration and respect to the late Andrew Dixon Carroll whose exemplary life and the conduct of his practice was a credit to the profession and a strength to his associates.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we extend to the members of his family our sincere and heartfelt sympathy in their loss and that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of the First Judicial District Court and that copies of this memorial be delivered to the family of the deceased.
