MR. LAWRENCE: May it please the Court, ladies and gentlemen:

I was asked by Carl's family to give this memorial. Carl Survine was a lawyer, a scholar, and a community service worker. He was described by one of his fellow attorneys as someone who never seemed to get burnt out on human nature. He was described by one of the judges as a personal of high principles who wanted to make his community a better place to live.

Carl Survine was born in Shreveport on May 4, 1953. He was a lifelong resident of Shreveport and attended the Lake Bethlehem Baptist Church where he was a member. graduated from Linnear High School where he was president of his class for four years. After high school, he received an academic scholarship to Southern University in Baton Rouge. And after graduating there where he was noted in the Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, and as one of the outstanding young men in America, he received the scholarship from the U.S. Department of Justice and attended Northeast University where he received a master's in criminal justice. Carl then went on to Southern

University Law School where he was awarded the George E. Mears Scholarship International Award. After law school, he became a clerk for the judges in the First Judicial District Court.

I first got to know him in 1986. He was one of the first new attorneys hired in the Public Defender's Office at that time. He worked in the Caddo Parish Indigent Defender office as a public defender as a staff attorney assigned to Section 2. Handled many, many, many cases on a daily basis. The outstanding thing about Carl is that after that is when he began his community service work and volunteer work after a hard day in court.

He was a clerk in the criminal justice committee in the State House of Representatives. Carl Survine was active in the community and had been appointed by the Caddo Parish Commission to be vice chairman of the Citizens Study Committe on juvenile courts and detention and was vice chairman of the Citizens Study Committee on the parish jail in 1989.

In addition to the contributions in the legal field, some of his outstanding accomplishments in the field of community service included volunteer activities which were focused on assisting the educational and

professional development of young people. He work at Rutherford House and Johnny Ray Jones youth shelter. He served as chairman on the Educating Tomorrow Advisory Committee of Caddo Parish School Board. Carl served on the Lighthouse board of directors. He served in the First Presbyterian Church juvenile justice program. Also as a youth mentor and coach with the Lighthouse Educational Center with the Volunteers of America. He coached a youth basketball team in Ledbetter Heights and was a foster parent for kids who have gone on to become very successful.

The Carl Survine Scholarship Fund was created as a living memorial to Carl, and on behalf of his many friends and his family and those who work with him, Carl was a lawyer and a man of honorable who served his community well. He will be missed by all, his family and those who worked with him, and he was a respected community leader.

I would ask that this memorial be made part of the record of the First Judicial District Court and a copy be made to be distributed to his family.
