JAMES H. GREENE

## January 11, 1917 - October 25, 1988

We, the undersigned committee, designated by the Shreveport Bar Association to prepare and submit the resolution to the memory of the late James H. Greene, a dedicated member of our Association, submit the following:

James H. Greene was born in Houston, Texas, on the 11th day of January, 1917. After moving to Shreveport, he graduated from Fair Park High School in 1935. He attended L.S.U. and graduated in August of 1941 with a degree in Journalism.

James H. Greene was married to Eloise Graham Greene on the 30th day of August, 1941. On January 19, 1942, their only child, Judy Lynn Greene, was born. He is survived by his devoted wife and daughter.

During World War II, he answered the call of his country by enlisting in the United States Navy in May of 1942 and served with honor and dignity, being honorably discharged in August, 1946, with the rank of Lieutenant. He was recalled in 1950 to active duty with the United States Navy during the Korean Conflict and served for an additional eighteen months.

After returning home, Jim began his civilian employment with the Clerk of Court for the Shreveport City Court. Thereafter, he was employed with Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office in the Civil Division. At the time of his retirement in 1983, he was head of the Civil Division.

Jim studied law at Centenary College. Upon passing the bar examination, he was admitted to the practice of law by the Louisiana Supreme Court. He was a member of both the Shreveport Bar Association and the Louisiana State Bar Association.

He was a devoted member of Broadmoor Baptist Church and served as a Deacon.

He was truly a fine gentleman -- of quiet but forceful manner, polite and considerate in his relationships with others, and always friendly and warmhearted to those with whom he had social, professional or business contacts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we of the Shreveport Bar Association, in this memorial, express our admiration and respect to the late James H. Greene, whose life and conduct exemplified the high standards of the legal profession.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we extend to his family the sympathy of each member of our Association in their loss, and that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the Minutes of the First Judicial District Court and that a copy of this memorial be delivered to the family of the deceased.
