We, the undersigned Committee, designated by the Shreveport Bar Association to prepare and submit the resolution to the memory of the late Walter Lake Fowler, a member of the Shreveport Bar, submit the following:

Walter Lake Fowler was born September 6, 1918, at Shreveport, Louisiana, where he was a life long resident. He attended
the Caddo Parish public schools, Louisiana Tech University,
Centenary College and Louisiana State University, where he received his law degree.

He married Adele Sloan Fowler who survives him. He is also survived by his mother, Mary Colquitt Fowler, two brothers, Dr. Sanders Fowler, Jr., and Dr. William B. Fowler, and two sisters, Mary Fowler Hearne and Harriet Fowler Destiche.

During World War II he served his country in the United States Army.

He was a member of the Louisiana Bar Association, Kappa Sigma Fraternity and an Episcopalian.

Mr. Fowler began the practice of law in Shreveport,
Louisiana, during 1950, but after a very brief time turned to
right of way work and joined the right of way department of
United Gas Pipeline Co., thereafter Texas Eastern Transmission
Corporation and served several other concerns. He was recognized and regarded as outstanding in this field.

While Mr. Fowler only engaged in the practice of law for a brief time he had many friends within the profession.

He was a person of whom it can be said there was never an unkind word spoken, nor was he known to have ever spoken an unkind word of a fellow being. He will long be remembered for his great gift of friendship and his death felt as a tremendous loss by his unusually large host of friends.
