In Memoriam

Joseph Donald McCarty

August 10, 1922 -- March 19, 1975

We, the undersigned, having been designated by the Shreveport Bar Association to prepare a memorial resolution for Joseph Donald McCarty, submit the following:

Joseph Donald McCarty, generally known as "Don McCarty", was born in Alexandria, Louisiana on August 10, 1922 and was a son of Charles and Iola Owers McCarty, both of whom predeceased him.

He grew up in Bossier City, graduated from high school there and later attended college at LSU and the University of Nebraska. After school, he went to work for the United Gas Company and, except for military service in World War II, he continued to work for United, under its various corporate names, until his death on March 19th of this year.

Don McCarty was a certified public accountant, and after attending night law school at Centenary College and successfully passing the bar examination, he was admitted to the practice of law in 1956.

While he never engaged in private practice to any substantial extent, he was actively engaged in handling cases for his company before the Federal Power Commission. His work for United was in the Rates and Regulatory Department, which he headed as a vice-president of the company at the time of his death.

Don McCarty never married and much of his life was devoted to the care and support of his widowed mother and an older brother. Both predeceased him and he left no surviving relatives here.

He was a Catholic, and a devout and active member of his church. He was also a member of numerous professional

organizations, including our association, and he was proud to be a lawyer.


Mr. McCarty was admired and respected by all who knew him and he will be sincerely missed.
