We, your undersigned Committee, beg leave to submit the following
Resolution of respect to the memory of
Miss Nancy Adele Kilpatrick.

October 19, 1955, Miss Nancy Adele Kilpatrick, who was a member
of the Shreveport Bar, passed away. She was among the first of her
sex to be admitted by the Supreme Court of our state to the practice
of law and the first to be enrolled in this District. Although in an
earlier day she followed her profession to some extent and acquitted
herself well, it is as an individual and as a secretary that we, your
Committee, remember her best.

In Miss Kilpatrick's nature were happily united excellent qualities
of mind and heart. Well educated, well versed in the meaning and use
of words, well trained in the art of thinking, she was a valuable
secretary and assistant to the lawyers for whom she worked. She
performed all of her arduous tasks as a legal secretary with skill,
accuracy and dispatch.

Dependable, kind, tactful, gracious and courteous, possessing a
keen sense of loyalty and constantly responsive to the demands of duty,
always and under all conditions, the gentle lady, Miss Kilpatrick's
well-spent life was a source of inspiration .

She was a devoted member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church of
Shreveport.

Nancy Adele Kilpatrick whose life was marked by service to others, by
devotion to high ideals, to principle, loyalty and duty, and whose
memory will be cherished by all who knew her.
