Family, friends, and fellow members of the bar,

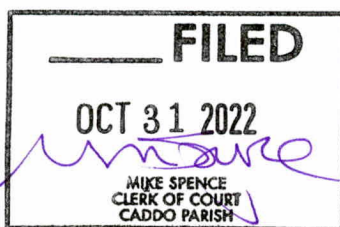




Joey will be missed by everyone and will live in our hearts and minds forever.
